

Two French firemen motor around Plymouth Sound yesterday after crossing the Channel in a Citroen car. Other seafarers in Sir Francis Drake's old base looked on in bewilderment as M Patrick Jegou, 38, and M Moses Didier, 28, sailed into the Plymouth port after 15 hours at sea. The red 2CV's 29 horse-power, 602cc twin cylinder air-cooled engine had powered them the 96 nautical miles from Roscoff by propeller at around six knots. The two men, from Morlaix, made the 12ft 6in-long craft by attaching a standard 2CV to a hull
